In June, Alyssa graduated from UC Irvine with honors in her double major of Economics and Environmental Studies. Dachywan, Stephen, Conrad, Elizabeth, and Elizabeth's parents all attended her graduation. Then we spent the next day at Disneyland. It was very nice to have everyone together in the Happiest Place on Earth! And it was especially nice since only a week later, Alyssa started her master's program in architecture at University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. It has been a big change for her. Almost all her functions have returned to normal, and she can do all the things that her current duties as housewife require. But she still has hand tremors and mild numbness & weakness that prevent her from going back to work. Hopefully these will also resolve during the planned 6 month leave with the help of occupational therapy.

Despite some challenges, 2016 has been good to the Wu Family. We are truly grateful for all our wonderful friends and for our family who have helped us get through the challenges. (Special thanks to Elizabeth's mom who moved in just before the surgery and took care of all the cooking, cleaning, shopping, EVERYTHING for the next TWO MONTHS+ !)
